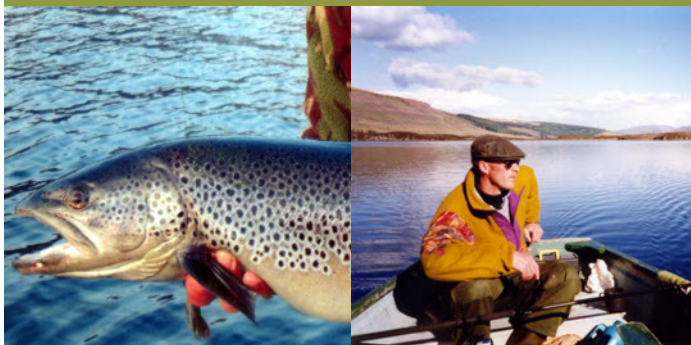

salmon and sea trout. Fishes well in a spate with fly or spinner. The loch itself is the second largest on Mull and has, in recent years, shown good stocks of wild fish. Records over many years show sea trout of up to 20lbs. and salmon well into the 20s. In the right conditions dapping works very well.

River - Fly & Spin

Mishnish Lochs and Loch Torr The Mishnish Lochs are run by the Tobermory Angling Association and are regularly stocked with

B 1 & B2 - Fly only, Beat 3 - Fly & Spin

River Bellart Narrow with steep peat banks, the Bellart runs to the sea in the village of Dervaig. Fishes well from late June for sea trout and late July onwards for salmon.

Fly, Spin & Bait

River Lussa Running from Loch Sguabain in Glen More to the sea at Loch Spelve, the Lussa is a spate river with some great pools. Not the

MULL'S LOCHS AND RIVERS - A BRIEF GUIDE...

Loch Frisa Mull's largest loch at five miles long offers brown trout throughout the season with salmon and sea trout from July onwards (boat and bank permits). Good bags of 'brownies' are common in the early part of the season. The largest brown trout caught here weighed nearly 15lbs. I have caught many fish over the years, weighing between 4lbs and 6lbs. Wind direction can play a great part in whether the loch fishes well or not.

Boat & Bank

Loch Ba and River Ba Two miles of a gravel bed river running from the sea at the head of Loch na Keal. Although this is a short river it does have some great holding pools for

brown trout. There are three boats available as well as bank fishing.

Fly & Bait only

Loch Torr Mainly brown trout with the occasional sea trout. The numbers of fish in this loch are great; although the fish are quite small they take well. This is a great loch for the novice fly fisherman.

Fly only

Aros Loch Again very accessible fishing, ideal for younger anglers. Predominantly rainbow trout with not too much room for fly fishing. Spinning and bait fishing are permitted.

Bank only

Aros River Spate river four miles long, running from Loch Frisa to the Sound of Mull at Aros

most accessible river on Mull but has, in the past, produced some great fish.

Fly, Spin & Bait

River Coladoir Salmon and sea trout. Running from Glen More, this time to Pennyghael, a gravel bed spate river with fishing that can prove to be hard work due to the distance between runs and pools and the grassy tufts along the banks. Again, worth the effort on the right day.
